Open Doors: Betsy Kolkea



Let's **give thanks** that a record 112 MPs attended Open Doors' launch of the 2026 World Watch List in January. Unfortunately our local MP, Callum Anderson, was not among them. I have written to point him to the recording of the event, and to encourage him to engage with this important advocacy work. Please write too if you are able.

Some key prayer points highlighted at the launch:

- An eight million rise in the number of Christians suffering high level of persecution - now 388 million.
- This year's biggest jump is Syria, rising 12 places to now be number six on the list., due to a surge in violence not attributed to the government but rather to security vacuums and local extremist groups.
- The 'smash and squeeze' that we've seen in Afghanistan, Algeria, China and Iran that continues to drive the church underground is now evident in Tunisia and Mauritania too.

Let's pray for each Christian brother and sister living with persecution, and let's speak the name of Jesus over them. Psalm 27: 'For on the day of trouble you will keep me safe in your dwelling'.
